An option suggested to us is in front of the wall near the corner of Addison Road and Denbeigh Place, where there is a grass verge. We are investigating the ownership of this land and would welcome comments.

New charity for neighbourhood groups



Bell Tower committee members have been helping to set up a new charity to support neighbourhood groups in Reading.

Established in December 2012, Reading Neighbourhood Network provides resources and training for neighbourhood groups - residents', community tenants' and associations, environmental groups and other organisations with an interest in their local area. RNN also supports individuals who are interested in starting a new group.

RNN has already held a workshop session to help groups get their message across to their members and local people, and more training sessions are planned during 2013.

Nearly 30 groups have already signed up as members of RNN, including the new Baker Street Area Neighbourhood Association which was founded in December with support from RNN. Several individuals have also expressed an interest in joining.
