## **A taste of North Africa - just around the corner!**

As readers will be aware, we're very well served for restaurants and bars not a stone's throw away from our part of town. But there's a

restaurant right on the Bell Tower area's doorstep that has variety and quite a buzz in entertainment.

La Fontana has recently come under new management and offers a wide range of food from around the Mediterranean and Near East. At weekends the restaurant really comes to life, with a variety of live entertainment from near and far. As

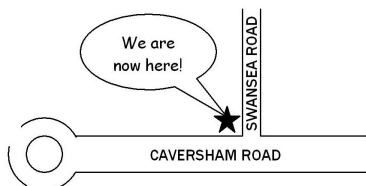
herbs and rice), Grilled Prawns (as above but larger) or Chicken Shawarma. There were also a range of six very reasonable pizza choices and nine pasta and risotto dishes in the £7-9 range. To accompany the meal there was a wide range of wines – in particular a good house Chardonnay, and several Mediterranean beers were also available. And to follow up a number of attractive desserts from Tiramisu to Lemoncello and the middle eastern Baklava for those with an especially sweet tooth.

La Fontana has adopted an interesting formula of live music and dance while you eat. On our three recent visits we have been entertained with a real variety – Egyptian, Flamenco, and swing with jumpin'-jive music from the 40's and 50's from the 'Ding Dong Daddios', a band of five lads that tour all over the south (trombone, jazz guitar, double-bass, drum and vocals). The Daddios did some skilful renditions of Mac the Knife, Hava Nagila and

a traveller to a number of the countries I can say that this really is the real McCoy. The décor is modern and roomy, with subdued lighting and a range of musical instruments as wall ornaments.

The food is varied around a Mediterranean theme – Middle Eastern, Moroccan, Egyptian, Lebanese, Greek and Italian. On our visits we found 15 appetisers on the menu averaging in price around £3.50, favourite examples of which were the mixed mezze of houmous, tzatziki, babaganough and olives, Gambary Meshwe – grilled butterfly prawns in cumin and garlic or mussels in garlic.

Then we passed on to a range of 16 house specials – decent portions averaging around £9-10 with examples of Beef or Chicken Tagine, Lamb Shank (with Mediterranean

## Late licence refused for Cardiff Road club

Cardiff Road residents and the Bell Tower Community Association teamed up with one of our local councillors to object to the Reading Deaf Social Club's application for an alcohol and entertainment licence until 2.00am six days a week.

As this club is in a residential area it was felt that such extended licensing hours were unreasonable and the noise would cause neighbours sleepless nights. Reading Borough Council's licensing applications committee refused the application but allowed restricted hours until 10.00pm Sunday, 10.30pm Monday to Thursday and 11.00pm Friday and Saturday.

## News in brief

● A very useful public meeting was held at New Hope on legal matters. We had myths about common law husbands and wives dispelled, and there was an update on the latest law regarding civil partnerships, pre-nuptial agreements and divorce. There was also advice on wills, inheritance tax planning and power of attorney.

● If you are in financial difficulties, be very careful about accepting loans from sources you don't know well. Loan sharks will often make friends with you then offer to lend you money (at exorbitant rates). Properly licensed money lenders will give you precise details on the amount of the loan, repayment details and interest charges, and all of this information will be *in writing*. If doubt ring 0300 555 2222 - this helpline has been set up by Reading Borough Council in partnership with Stop Loan Sharks.

● If you have a mobility scooter you need to ensure that your household insurance covers where you keep the vehicle and that the scooter is not only kept safely but also positioned so that you can leave the house safely in an emergency. Further advice is available from Help the Aged.

● There has been a burglary reported in the area where entry was gained through a back window. Don't forget to close all ground floor windows when you are out - it is also advisable to fit locks to all accessible windows.

● As well as the Bell Tower public meeting in October there will be a planning committee meeting to discuss the station development and its impact on the area around the station. Members of the public are welcome to attend as observers. The development will have a significant effect on our area, so the meeting will be well worth attending. The meeting will be held on Wednesday 23 September at 6.30pm at the Civic Centre.
