A place to rest in Randolph Road

We have received a grant to provide a bench and noticeboard, and intend to install these near the electricity substation in Randolph Road. This will give neighbours a chance to rest, have a chat and read the latest local news on our second

noticeboard. We already have a noticeboard by the main entrance to E P Collier School in Swansea Road, and are pleased to be able to put another in a more visible place. We hope to have the seat and noticeboard in place early in 2013.

Community First is an £80 million government-funded programme that will run for four years, until March 2015. This program of funding for community projects will help our community come together, to identify our strengths and suggest ideas for improvement. Abbey and Battle have been identified as the two target wards for the scheme in Reading, so our area is eligible for funding.

We are looking for ideas that could address one or more of the following:

- ♦ improve the local environment
- ♦ promote cohesion between different groups
- ♦ address antisocial behaviour

As a result of applications made in the first year we have received funding for a new bench and noticeboard and a floral competition for next year. Applications for next year's grants can be made right now - the deadline is 31 December.

News in brief

- A planning application has been submitted for change of use of 69 Caversham Road into a 24 hour gym. The site is currently occupied by Oliver Matthews furniture store, and the application does not include the Dawson's Music shop. According to the applicants the number of users during night time hours is predicted to be low.

- Work continues on the railway development behind Cardiff Road and Barry Place. The sidings are under construction, with the track now laid. Work has started on access paths and the track will be aligned during the winter, with overall

completion expected in March. Planting on the embankment will start in January.

The tall steel poles that have recently appeared on the embankment are for overhead lines, in preparation for electrification. The region's main routes are due for electrification by 2015. The train care depot in Cow Lane is reported to be three months ahead of schedule, and is expected to be ready for use by the end of next May. The existing depot can then be demolished to make way for the new viaduct.

Meanwhile, the new station entrances, bridge and additional platforms are going up fast, and are due to open in April 2013. Details at www.networkrail.co.uk/reading.
